EYFS outcomes since 2010 have improved significantly. In 2013, the proportion of children at a good level of development is in line with the national average. In 2014 the proportion of children at GLD is above the National Average and there is a significant increase from 2013.

KS1 Average Point Scores in 2013 were significantly above national means for reading, writing and all subjects. APS show considerable improvement since 2011. As predicted there was a dip in the 2014 APS due to difference in cohort but internal progress measures show that progress is at least good and indicates rapid and sustained progress from starting points.

The children eligible for pupil premium funding have achieved above the national average APS in all areas over the last 3 years. The PPG APS at the end of Yr 2 2014 is predicted to be high and significantly above the National Average.
