Pupil Premium

Overview

The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantaged children reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with pupils from Reception to Y11 who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are looked after or have parents currently in the Armed Forces. In 2011/2012 the funding allocated was £488 per child, £200 for children of Armed Forces Families. This rose to £600 and £250 respectively in 2012/2013. From April 2012 the coverage of the Premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years. As a school we are aware of all vulnerable children and understand that not all FSM pupils are vulnerable and that some children who need additional support do not have Free School Meals.

Total Amount Allocated to Mildmay Infant & Nursery School for academic year 2011/2012: £3900

The funding given was used to benefit our children in the following ways:

Learning Support Assistant Hours were allocated to the following support strategies:

- 1:1 targeted reading with LSA.
- Literacy intervention groups with Fisher Family Trust trained LSA's.
- Yr 2 Comprehension Focus Groups
- Yr2 Maths focus groups
- Yr1 Literacy interventions
- Yr 1 Maths interventions
- 1:1 Speech and Language sessions with trained LSA.
- Purchase of new phonic materials
- Purchase of guided reading books (specifically for boys, including non-fiction)

Results at the end of KS1 for those pupils entitled to Pupil Premium:

- (There were 4 children in Yr 2 2011 – 2012)
- 100% of the children achieved 2C+ in reading and writing which was well above average.
- 100% of the children achieved 2C+ in maths which was above average.
- 100% of the children achieved 2B+ in writing which was well above average.
- 75% of the children achieved 2B+ in reading which was well above average.
- 75% of the children achieved 2B+ in maths which was above average.

- The children made 10.0 average points progress in reading, 9.1 points progress in writing and 8.6 points progress in maths.

Results at the end of Foundation Stage for those pupils entitled to Pupil Premium:

Year group attainment average: 7.4 points total: 96.8 points.

Average points progress from start to end rec: 5.7

EYFS Free School Meals Data:

- 2 children in cohort.
- Average points: 7.6 total average 98.5
- Points progress from start to end of rec: average: 5.8
- 50% (1 child) scored 78 points including 6 points in CLL & PSE
- 100% made at least 4 points progress
- 100% 6 points in PSE

Interventions:

- Reading daily to an adult
- Extra small group phonics work.
- Extra class based support

LSA Hours to provide the following:

- Support for phased phonics groups.
- Speech & Language groups with trained LSA's
- Intervention groups according to needs highlighted through pupil tracking meetings
- Continued monitoring and tracking of pupils
- Bubble Time wellbeing support.
- Provision Mapped support through reverse inclusion.
